SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Be a 2024 graduating senior.
- Plan to attend a two- or four-year accredited college or university.
 - If selected, proof of enrollment will be required to receive scholarship funds.
- Have at-least a 2.7 grade point average.
- Submit an unofficial high school transcript.
- Submit a 650-800 word typed essay on the provided prompt.
 - 2024 Prompt: Describe a personal experience or significant moment in your life that has shaped your current passion. Explain how, or if, this experience has influenced your educational and career goals moving forward.
